V Levels

V Levels will be launching in September 2027. One V Level qualification is equivalent to one A Level qualification, and they combine academic knowledge with practical, industry-focused skills, helping students build both confidence and real-world experience for their future.

Foundation Learning courses are suitable for any student who needs a little extra time to prepare for college, or has not quite met the entry requirements for a full-time college course.

Students will focus on working towards their essential English and maths qualifications, as well as developing their interpersonal and employability skills on a pathway that relates to their future ambitions.

ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (ESOL)

Our full-time ESOL course for young people aged 16-19 is designed to help students improve their English speaking, listening, reading and writing skills. This programme allows students to then go on to other college courses relating to their career aspirations.

SKILLS FOR INDEPENDENCE, LIFE & WORK

Our Skills for Independence, Life & Work courses give students with learning difficulties and/or disabilities the chance to build confidence and practical skills.

Students also gain hands-on experience at our Wellbeing Community Café in Orford Community Hub, a real working environment where they learn to prepare meals and snacks while developing essential skills in customer service, teamwork, and communication.

SUPPORTED INTERNSHIPS

Supported Internships are a great next step for young people aged 17-24 who want to move into paid employment. They are especially suited to those with an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP), but there are also some opportunities available for young people without one.

These programmes combine real work experience with individualised support, helping students build confidence, develop workplace skills, and gain the experience employers are looking for. Interns spend most of their time in a work setting, supported by experienced staff who help them learn on the job and succeed in securing sustainable employment at the end of their internship.

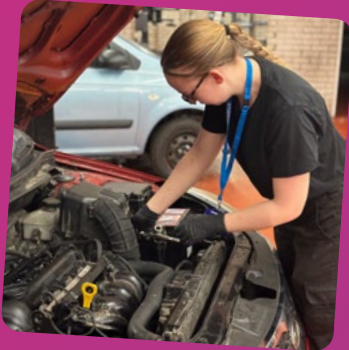

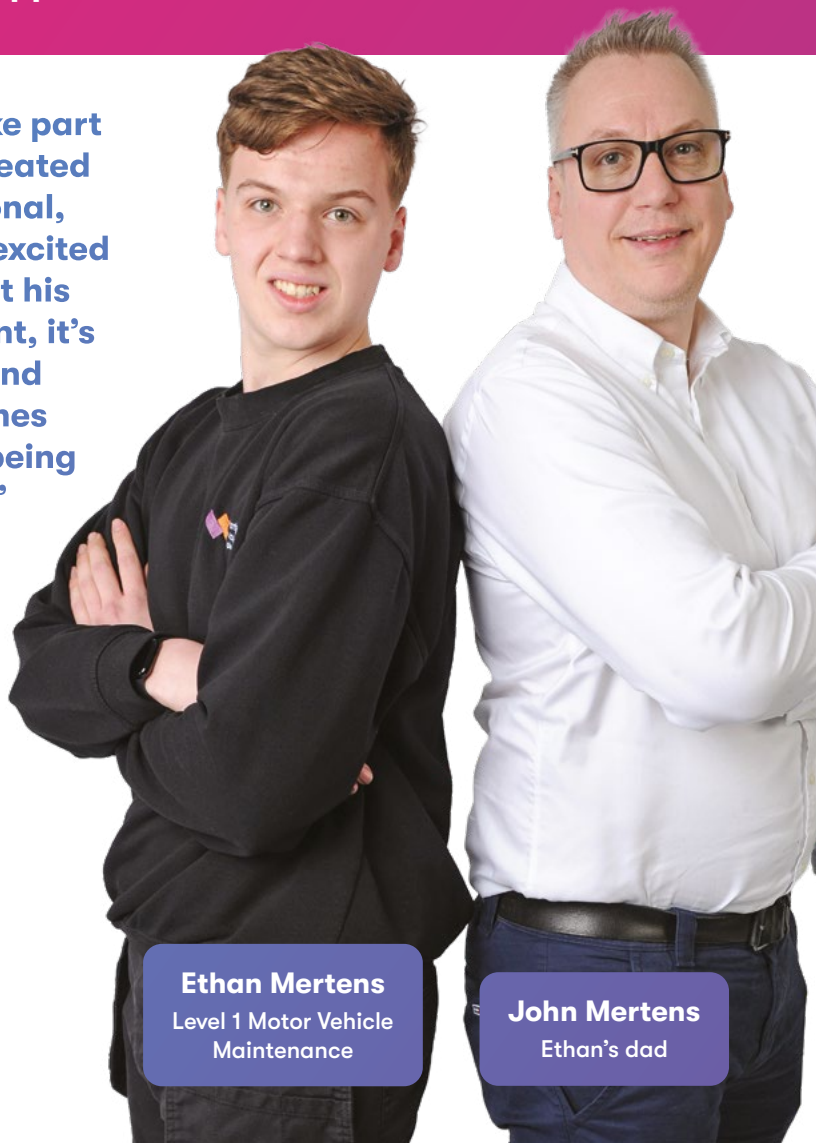

Summer Adventure 2026

This year, our students travelled to Sri Lanka for a two-week placement programme across a range of specialisms, including Health & Social Care, Digital, Sport, Childcare, and Construction. Working alongside local organisations and educational partners, students applied their skills in real-world environments, from observing healthcare professionals in hospitals, delivering sports activities in schools to supporting community projects and helping to rebuild local facilities.

Beyond their placements, students immersed themselves in the local culture through community and conservation projects, traditional workshops, and cultural experiences. For many, it was their first time travelling so far from home, providing a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to build resilience, adaptability, and a deeper understanding of the world around them.

6 Enrol in person

You will be invited to enrol on GCSE Results Day or the day after.

This is where your place at college is confirmed and you are officially ready to start in September!

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Can I apply for more than one course?

Yes, you can apply for more than one course, but you will only enrol on your preferred course on GCSE Results Day.

You will have the opportunity to try the courses you have applied for during our College Experience Evenings, which will help you to make the right choice for your next step.

What level of course do I apply for?

Apply for the level of course that you would like to study and is achievable with your predicted GCSE grades.

Is there an application deadline?

We don't have an official application deadline, but we strongly encourage prospective students to submit their application as early as possible and preferably before Christmas!

What is the difference between applying and enrolling?

Once you have applied, you will be invited to an interview and, if you are successful, you will be given a conditional offer and be invited back to the college on GCSE Results Day to enrol.
