

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Warrington & Vale Royal College is passionate about offering a wide range of courses to suit **ALL** levels of ability. Upon leaving school, your pupils can choose from a variety of technical courses, T Levels, and apprenticeships, ranging from entry level to level 3.

Entry Level

No minimum grades required. Every day skills in reading and writing, basic literacy and numeracy skills, and a willingness to learn.

Level 1

Minimum of 4 GCSEs at grade 2 or above.

Level 2

Minimum of 4 GCSEs at grade 3 or above, including English or maths.

Construction Trades

Minimum of 4 GCSEs. This must include English & maths at grade 4 or above, and 2 other GCSEs at grade 3 or above.

Hairdressing / Hospitality & Catering

Minimum of 4 GCSEs at grade 3 or above, including English or maths at grade 4 or above.

Level 3

Minimum of 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English and/or maths.

Engineering

Minimum of 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English, maths, & science.

T Level

Minimum of 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English & maths.

Adult Nursing / Engineering

Minimum of 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English, maths, & science.

T Level Foundation Year

Minimum of 4 GCSEs at grade 3 or above, including English or maths at grade 4 or above.

Growth Mindset Interactive Workshop

Designed by our award-winning Careers Team, the Growth Mindset Interactive Workshop helps students reshape the way they approach their goals and view setbacks. Focused on building resilience and self-belief, the session explores how to embrace the principles of a growth mindset and how to understand and manage feelings of failure.

After proving highly successful in college, we are now bringing this workshop to our school partners. In an hour-long session delivered in school by our Careers Team, pupils will learn what a growth mindset is, discover practical strategies to apply it in everyday thinking, and explore how challenges and setbacks can become opportunities for growth.

Throughout their final years at high school, each pupil will build a meaningful connection with their mentor, who will share their expertise, guidance, and encouragement. The programme is designed to help pupils develop the essential skills that employers value most, such as communication, planning, and leadership, while boosting their confidence and giving them a strong sense of direction for the future.

TRANSITION & SUPPORT ME

Student support is central to everything that we do at Warrington & Vale Royal College. The college's Transition and Learning Support Teams want to provide all of the support available to ensure every student planning to attend the college feels equipped, informed, and confident to do so.

Transition Sessions

We recognise that by supporting students to prepare for college before enrolment, they have a greater chance of engaging, attending, achieving, and progressing, reducing the risk of becoming NEET. At the start of term 3, our teams will contact your pastoral teams to ask whether you feel any of your students would benefit from attending our transition sessions once their GCSE exams are over.

Welcome Workshop

June, July & August 2026

A series of three sessions for applicants who are suffering with anxiety, or have been on significantly reduced timetables at school. Here, a member of our team will discuss college expectations, pastoral support available, and raise awareness of coping strategies.

Meet the Pastoral Team

June, July & August 2026

A session for applicants who need to meet the college Pastoral Team. Children in care or applicants with professionals involved may benefit from this session.

Expectations of College Life

June, July & August 2026

A session to meet the college's Student Support Team. Ideal for applicants who may have struggled with expectations at school. The session will cover attendance, behaviour, and the commitment required for college, as well as exploring the mechanisms available to support future students in achieving this.

Safeguarding

It is essential that schools share any safeguarding information or concerns ahead of an applicant enrolling with us. This is to ensure that the college is ready to support them as soon as they arrive. The Safeguarding Team will attend any social care meetings, usually from term 3 onwards.

Educational Health Care Plans (EHCP)

The Transition & Learning Support
Teams recognise that applicants
with EHCPs are likely to need a
bespoke transition programme to aid
them in their move from school to
college.

There are several options available including:

- College staff attending Year 11 annual reviews
- Tours of the college, both 1:1 and small groups
- Multiple visits to college, including the opportunity to attend classes and stay for different parts of the college day
- Tailored transition plans to suit the needs of the applicant and include parents, if appropriate.

Pastoral Support

All students have a Progress Coach who meets with them regularly, monitors their attendance and performance, and offers advice and guidance.

Our highly-trained Safeguarding Team work closely with Progress Coaches to help students overcome any issues affecting their wellbeing, including physical and mental health, welfare, financial worries, and personal issues.

Additional Learning Support

Our dedicated Additional Learning Support (ALS) Team work with students to develop the skills, behaviours, and attitudes to enable them to realise their full potential and prepare them for their next steps.

When applying for a course, pupils are strongly encouraged to disclose any disability or learning difficulty so that we can ensure the appropriate support is in place when they start college.

Support may include:

- Exam access arrangements
- In-class support (prompts, readers, and scribes)
- Lunchtime and break support
- Meet and greet
- Mobility support
- · Modification of learning materials
- Orientation
- Specialist resources and equipment (laptops with assistive software, Dictaphone, and reader pens).

OUR STUDENT JOURNEY

We encourage all prospective students to apply as early as possible to secure their conditional offer to study at the college. Applications opened in September and we recommend that all applicants apply by no later than **Friday 30**th **January 2026**.

1. Apply Online

Year 11s should visit **wvr.ac.uk/16-18** or our digital prospectus, find their chosen course and click "apply now". They can also download the MyWVR app to track their application.

School contacts will receive regular updates on all applications and their statuses.

2. Attend an Interview

This is a mandatory part of the journey to college. The applicant will meet their tutor, speak with our Support & Wellbeing Teams, and may receive a conditional offer to study.

The School Engagement Team will send you Interview Evening reminders.

3. Year 11s must accept their offer on the MyWVR app

4. Attend an Applicant Exclusive Event

Applicants will try their course and meet their future classmates.









5. Enrol in person

If an applicant has received a conditional offer of a place, they will be invited to enrol on GCSE Results Day or the day after. This is where their place at college is confirmed, so they must attend.

School References

The conditions of an applicant's offer are based on:

- A) GCSE Results
- B) A satisfactory school reference

Schools are required to submit a digital reference for each applicant. Offers may be withheld without a reference, so we ask that you submit these as soon as possible after they have been requested by our Admissions Team.



GOOD TO KNOW

Getting to College

Both our Warrington and Winsford campuses are centrally located and easily accessible by public transport. We also offer free parking and bike sheds on campus for students.

We have six direct bus routes to our Warrington campus, reserved for full-time 16-18-year-old students only. Places on these services are subject to demand.

2026-2027 services are currently under review.

College Bursary

Warrington & Vale Royal College can support students with costs associated with attending college. Any of our 16-18-year-old students, excluding those enrolled on an apprenticeship programme, may be eligible for the College Discretionary Bursary if their total household income is below £40,000 per year*.

We will consider several areas of support including travel costs (students must live over one mile from the campus you study at to receive this type of support), costs for essential uniform, kit/equipment, and compulsory educational visits.

FREE Breakfast

All 16-18-year-old students are welcome to enjoy a free breakfast at the Crescent Café (Warrington) and Atrium Café (Winsford). Enjoy toast, cereal, or fruit and a drink before heading to class!
